- Multiple manuscript deposit processes required to ensure REF eligibility at each institution – with their associated chasing (where applicable)



Potential issues:

- Publishers as content providers upon acceptance?

- Sufficiently widespread uptake among data providers and data consumers?

Multiple deposit 'fixed' – but some other issues remain

Researchers moving across UK institutions raise multiple issues:

- Evolving affiliations on publications while in transit
- Previous publications automatically imported into new system – showing unevenness of deposit patterns
- Funding sources left behind: whose role is it to deal with the APC payments?

Re-use of deposits: pros and cons

There is value in gradually persuading researchers of including systematic deposit of accepted manuscripts in their publishing workflow

Strong and periodically renewed advocacy is required though, thus favouring research-intensive HEIs with larger OA teams

- Could the network nodes become more easily identifiable, maybe with some help from UKCoRR?


Cooperative Open Access eXchange (COAX) - a proposal

Elevator pitch

According to estimation by colleagues at EDINA, based on data gathered by the [Repository Junction Broker](#) (also formerly known as the Jisc Publications Router), the mean average number of authors for a scholarly article is 6.3. This means that, when the corresponding author does the right thing and deposits the manuscript in their local institutional repository there are, on average and potentially, 5 other repositories which might be interested in getting a copy of that manuscript. **What if institutional repositories could participate in a cooperative mechanism, sharing manuscripts between them according to need?**
