
Why Social Media Matters for You

"Social media has become an inescapable part of academic life. It has the power to transform **scholarly communication** and offers new opportunities to **publish** and **publicise** your work, to **network** in your discipline and beyond and to **engage** the public". So says Mark Carrigan, author of <u>Social Media for Academics</u>, now in its second edition.

For teachers, the appropriate use of technology and social media tools can enhance **communication** and **interaction** with students, support students to develop peer and professional **networks**, and promote a culture of **innovation** in teaching and learning.

And, from the perspective of student engagement, social media can play an important role in student **recruitment**, promoting **access to services**, and **celebrating the achievements** of learners.
